

# Worksheet 6 My Community: Amelia Earhart

There are lots of great female pilots in history.

One of them is Amelia Earhart. Let's read the short passage about her below.



#### **Amelia Earhart**

Amelia Earhart was born in 1897 in the United States. When she was around 18, she worked at a Canadian military hospital and became friends with some pilots. She became interested in flying.

After that, Earhart studied at at Columbia University, then the University of Southern California. She had flying lessons with a female pilot, Neta Snook. When she was 25, Earhart bought her first plane. She was the first woman to fly up to 14,000 feet in the air.

In 1928, a publisher, George Putnam, invited Earhart to fly across the Atlantic Ocean by plane. Earhart succeeded as a passenger, and she became very famous. In 1932, Earhart flew across the Atlantic Ocean alone, as the pilot. She was the first woman to do that in history.
